Reading books should be carried in a red book bag (Yr R,1 & 2) or backpack (Yr 3-6)	

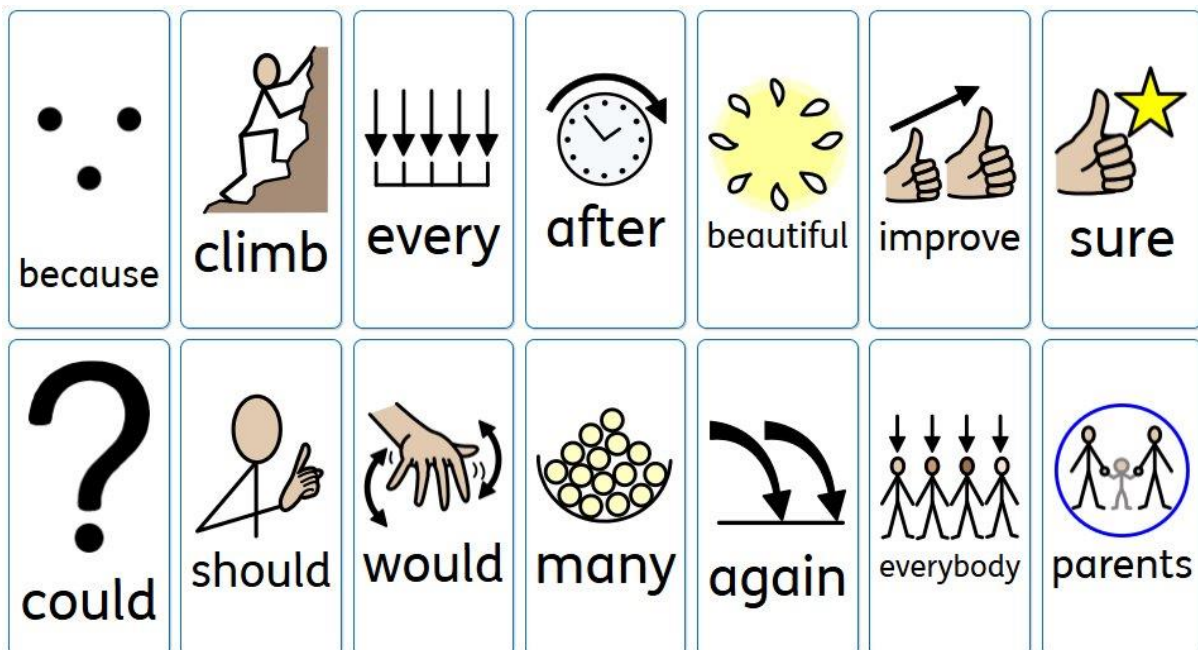
