Dear Parents,

This week, the children had a fantastic time making their own Sledging Biscuits. We have completed our Geography topic about hot and cold places, we think we would like to live in a hot place at the moment! After half term we will start a history topic – What was important to ancient Egyptians?

Below is our recipe we used to make our 'sledging biscuits'. It has been great to hear how much the children loved them!

150g plain white flour ½ tsp baking soda ½ tsp salt 30g butter 50ml cold water

Instructions:

- 1. Pre-heat the oven to 200C
- Measure the flour, baking soda and salt and put together into a mixing bowl,
- Rub in the butter with your fingertips until you have combined the ingredients to resemble breadcrumbs.
- Slowly mix in the water until a malleable ball of dough forms. The dough should not be sticky.
- 5. Split your dough into 4 servings for each child.
- Lightly flour a smooth surface and roll out the dough. Add your ingredients.
- Once you have the desired shape, transfer the dough onto your grease proof paper.
- 8. Prick each square with a fork.
- Bake in the oven for 15 minutes or until the dough just starts turning golden brown.
- 10. Remove from the oven and place on a cooling rack.
