Below are some of the things we have learnt this week. Your child might like to tell you a little more about a few of these:

We had a fantastic Christmas Art Day - the children thoroughly enjoyed themselves and made lots of decorations for the classroom and home ©

Continued to work on subtraction in Maths using a number line.

Learnt about using exclamation marks and wrote exclamation and command sentences.

Continued with our RE topic 'Prophecy and Promise', and listened to the nativity story. Then we made finger puppets and retold the story to our friends.

In Computing, we continued with our topic 'Digital Painting' and used different tools to create our pictures.

In Science, we learnt how trees change over the seasons. We looked at the trees in the playground and used the terms 'deciduous' and 'evergreen'.

In Geography, we drew a simple map of the playground using our own symbols and a key.

Handwriting Guidance


Handwriting Position:
