
## Dillon Condren - Year 6:

The closing date for **primary** level admissions is **15th January 2023**. Please note: to qualify for a place at 4 years of age, a child must have been born between 1 September 2017 and 31 August 2018.

## **Admissions for Secondary School 2023**

Parents of Year 6 children moving to secondary school also need to apply online to their Local Authority (either Surrey or Hampshire County Council) at <a href="https://www.surreycc.gov.uk/admissions">www.surreycc.gov.uk/admissions</a> Online applications can be submitted from now until 31st October 2022 - early applications (by mid-October) are encouraged!

Catholic secondary schools (including All Hallows) and some other secondary schools will require you to complete their Supplementary Information Form (SIF). The SIF for All Hallows includes a requirement for the form to be signed by Mrs Best. Please drop these in to the school office for signing (before October half term). Please see individual school websites for information regarding open day arrangements this year.

## **Y6 District League Netball**


Due to weather and other schools pulling out of the league the netballers have had very few matches this month but they have been training hard and Mrs Ramsden has been pleased with their progress.

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## **Swimming:**

## **Requirements to pass the National Curriculum Swimming:**

Swim 25 metres on their back using a recognised stroke and then without stopping 25 metres on their back of a recognised stroke.

Tread water for ½ a minute and spin around whilst treading water.

Submerge under the water to test their water confidence.

Please note this is different from 'Stage' swimming at outside swimming classes. National Curriculum swimming is all about keeping children safe in water where Stage swimming outside will work on initially teaching the children to swim and then improving the children's swimming strokes.

## **Y5 Curriculum Swimming**

Group 1 of Year 5 have started their swimming lessons and we can already see progress, some already managing to pass their National Curriculum swimming. Further Y5 and Y4 swimming groups will take place later in the academic year.

#### **KS2 Elite Swim Squad**

Swim squad training has resumed at the crack of dawn on a Monday morning. Thank-you to the parents for getting their children out of bed and down to the pool for their training sessions. So far we have been working on race starts for the different strokes in preparation for the District Gala on Thursday 9<sup>th</sup> February 2023.
